

PIKOM LEAD 2024: Malaysia Hosts Indian Tech Delegation, Strengthens Digital Ties

PIKOM LEAD 2024, officiated by YB Gobind Singh Deo, Malaysia's Digital Minister, and supported by H.E. Through B2B sessions co-hosted with MDEC, tech showcases, and strategic visits, the delegation explored collaborative opportunities and the strength of Malaysia's innovation ecosystem.

Emphasizing on the significance of the Malaysia-India collaboration, YB Gobind Singh Deo said, "It is important that we identify sectors in both countries we can work with and bring those partnerships together. It will then have a ripple effect that broadens our reach in these sectors. We need to create awareness, and support our SMEs and MSMEs. We need all Malaysians to come on board this digital transformation journey, by making things more efficient and less costly for businesses."

PIKOM LEAD 2024 Organising Chair, Millie Yong welcomed participants by emphasizing the summit's goal to unite industry leaders in addressing global and local challenges, creating partnerships, and strategizing for future growth.
